I. PURPOSE:

To provide for the highest degree of safety to all deputies while on duty.

To establish procedures for the use of the soft body armor vest as an item of Sheriff Office safety equipment.

II. POLICY:

The most valuable resource of the Sheriff's Office is its personnel. Any loss due to injury is a substantial loss to the Sheriff's Office. Therefore, a primary objective of the Sheriff's Office is loss of control with proven loss prevention techniques. The policy of the Sheriff's Office shall be to provide to all sworn personnel a protective soft body armor vest.

III. PROCEDURE:

A. ISSUE AND USE

1. All sworn personnel shall be issued a soft body armor vest. Make, model and threat level shall conform to the National Institute of Justice standard #0101.03 (NIJ.06) for threat level protection.
2. Sheriff's Office members must wear the protective soft body armor vest while involved in uniformed operations. Exceptions to this rule may apply to administrative uniformed personnel. However, deputies in the Investigative and Administrative Divisions who choose not to wear their protective vest must have it immediately available at all times, during their tour of duty.
3. Deputies with a medical/physical reason to not wear a protective vest, must present a statement signed by their physician stating, the reason they cannot wear the protective vest.
4. Body armor shall not be stored in a trunk compartment of any Sheriff's Office vehicle.
5. Body armor shall be worn while performing hazardous duties such as stake outs, planned felony arrests, tactical functions or when directed by a supervisor under potential or known volatile or hazardous conditions.
6. The vest may be worn under the uniform shirt or over the uniform shirt in an approved vest shell.

7. All deputies working in law enforcement related secondary employment positions/paid details, approved through the Sheriff's Office, must wear protective soft body armor vest.

B. MAINTENANCE AND CARE

1. Personnel shall maintain the vest in a clean and serviceable condition.
2. The vest is subject to periodic inspections by supervisory personnel, as are uniforms and other Sheriff's Office equipment.
3. Cleaning shall be done only according to the manufacturer's instructions, as contained in the Kevlar Personal Body Armor Facts Book.

C. DAMAGE INSPECTION

1. Immediately after the vest has been subject to stress (attack by sharp or blunt objects, projectiles, or substantial impact), the vest is to be examined for damage to the Kevlar fabric.
2. Any attack to the vest shall be reported in writing to the deputy's supervisor and shall be inspected by the manufacturer or his representative.
3. If the Kevlar has been damaged or penetrated, it will be immediately replaced.
4. If the vest has become wet, allow it to air dry naturally.

D. REPLACEMENT AND REPAIRS

1. The Sheriff's Office will establish a vest replacement program following the manufacturers' recommended life expectancy of the vest.
2. The Sheriff's Office will replace or repair all vests damaged in the line of duty.
3. The deputy shall be responsible for replacement or repair of the vest under the following circumstances:
 - a. Weight gain or weight loss that makes the vest unwearable.
 - b. Damage caused by negligence or not in the line of duty.
 - c. Wear caused by faulty maintenance.
 - d. Theft or loss due to negligence.

i. the applicant understands that the applicable statutes pertaining to civil rights will include section 601 of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. § 2000d); section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. § 794); section 901 of the Education Amendments of 1972 (20 U.S.C. § 1681); and section 303 of the Age Discrimination Act of 1975 (42 U.S.C. § 6102);

ii. the applicant understands that the applicable statutes pertaining to nondiscrimination may include section 815(c) of Title I of the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 (42 U.S.C. § 3789d(c)); section 1407(e) of the Victims of Crime Act of 1984 (42 U.S.C. § 10604(e)); section 299A(b) of the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act of 2002 (42 U.S.C. § 5672(b)); and that the grant condition set out at section 40002(b)(13) of the Violence Against Women Act (42 U.S.C. § 13925(b)(13)) also may apply; and

iii. on behalf of the applicant, I make the specific assurances set out in 28 C.F.R. §§ 42.105 and 42.204.

e. The applicant also understands that (in addition to any applicable program-specific regulations and to applicable federal regulations that pertain to civil rights and nondiscrimination) the federal regulations applicable to the award (if any) made by OJP based on the application may include, but are not limited to, 2 C.F.R. Part 2800 (the DOJ "Part 200 Uniform Requirements") and 28 C.F.R. Parts 22 (confidentiality - research and statistical information), 23 (criminal intelligence systems), and 46 (human subjects protection).

f. I assure that the applicant will give the Department and the Government Accountability Office, through any authorized representative, access to, and opportunity to examine, all paper or electronic records related to the award (if any) made by OJP based on the application. The applicant agrees that documentation to support the BVP application and payment requests will be kept for at least a three year period.

g. I certify that submission of this application for funding under the BVP Grant Act constitutes the legally binding acceptance by the applicant of the terms and conditions set forth in the application, and of the BVP program's statutory, regulatory, and programmatic requirements, restrictions, and conditions.

h. The applicant understands that, in the case of any equipment or products that may be purchased under an award under the BVP Grant Act, it is the sense of the Congress that

BVP recipients receiving the assistance should, in expending the award funds, purchase only American-made equipment and products.

i.  - i. The criteria and protocols, made available by the BVP program, for providing "uniquely fitted" ballistic or stab-resistant vests to officers have been reviewed.
 - ii. All of the applicant's law enforcement and corrections officers have been provided with access to the ASTM International "Standard Practice for Body Armor Wearer Measurement and Fitting of Armor"-ASTM Standard E3003-and the Justice Information Technology Center's "Personal Armor Fit Assessment".
 - iii. All of the applicant's law enforcement and corrections officers have been notified that, upon their request, they will be provided with the opportunity to receive a protective vest that is uniquely fitted to them.

Note: In the BVP Program, "uniquely fitted vests" means protective (ballistic or stab-resistant) armor vests that conform to the individual wearer to provide the best possible fit and coverage, through a combination of 1) correctly-sized panels and carrier, determined through appropriate measurement, and 2) properly adjusted straps, harnesses, fasteners,

flaps, or other adjustable features. The requirement that body armor be "uniquely fitted" does not necessarily require body armor that is individually manufactured based on the measurements of an individual wearer.
