WHEREAS, since 1849, the County of Ellis, Texas has pursued a more heavenly country with the truth and righteousness of the Lord at its forefront; and


WHEREAS, for 172 years, the County of Ellis, Texas has been blessed with an abundance of men and women who uphold the power of prayer; and
