

How to look up an Ellis County address to view district layers (Commissioner, Justice of the Peace(JP)/Constable, City, ISD, TCEQ Water, Voting Precincts, etc)


Step 1. Go to the Ellis County website, WWW.co.ellis.tx.us, at the bottom of the page Click on the Maps icon. (Best viewed in Chrome, Internet Explorer not recommended)



Step 2. Click on “Ellis County Web Map”.


Check mark to agree to the above terms and conditions, then press ok.

Step 3. On the left side of the screen, Click on stacked layers  icon called “Layer List”.


Step 4a. Click on the word “EllisCo_External_2”, All possible layers will appear.

Step 4b. Click on the word “Boundaries”, to locate “JP & Constable Precincts”, “Commissioner”, “Water Districts”, “ISD Districts” whatever layer you would like to view. Or Click on “Voting Precincts and Wards” to locate current voting precincts and the City of Ennis Commissioner Ward Districts.



Step 5. Type in the address of the location and make the selection in the drop-down box. The streets data is maintained by the County GIS Department and updated regularly from 911 data.
